



UCLA Faculty Club

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The UCLA Faculty Club is offering key supporters inspiring opportunities in recognition of their generosity.

Listed here are the primary venues in the Faculty Club for hosting academic as well as more personal gatherings. In keeping with the mid-century-modern aesthetic that the Club embodies, each room has an adjacent patio that serves as an extension of the primary space or as a separate venue in its own right. The California Room is being renamed the Morrison Room, in recognition of the lead donation by Professors Sherie and Donald Morrison. Their enormously generous gift is funding modernization throughout the Faculty Club, including renovation of the kitchen and Served, updating of carpeting, and a complete renovation of the largest private room in the Club.

SHERIE AND DONALD MORRISON ROOM - NAMED

This room, formerly the California Room, is the largest private room in the Faculty Club, serving as the primary site for academic conferences, concerts, banquets, film screenings, organizational retreats, wedding ceremonies, and receptions. The renovated space will reflect these multiple uses with a mid-century-modern aesthetic but include updated audio-visual systems.

WEST PATIO - \$500,000

Adjacent to the Served, the West Patio will be enhanced through new hardscaping and plantings that will beautify and extend this pleasant outdoor area. Attractive new patio tables and chairs will add to the popularity and charm of this area. The installation of an important fountain—made in 1963 by master fountain-maker George Tsutakawa—will enhance the setting.

MAIN DINING ROOM - \$1,500,000


The Main Dining Room is the primary dining space and the largest event venue in the Faculty Club. Surrounded on three sides by floor-to-ceiling windows, it offers a view of the surrounding neighborhood and the Garden Patio. It is ideal for weddings, large receptions, concerts, life celebrations, banquets, and conferences. Extensive refurbishment includes painting, carpet, audio-visual systems, enhanced outdoor-indoor integration, and furnishings.

FRONT ENTRANCE AND LOBBY - \$1,000,000

Donor-provided funds will beautify the approach and arrival through new signage, planters, and landscaping. At the threshold, an elegant new doorway will signal quality and hospitality. An enlarged lobby with a reception desk will connect guests to the Garden Patio, the Main Dining Room, and the hallway gallery.

FACULTY CLUB FRONT TERRACE - \$1,000,000

Premier landscape architect Mia Lehrer will renovate the Faculty Club's front terrace. Her renovation will include the installation of climate-adaptive plantings and low-water landscaping with efficient irrigation. Lehrer is internationally recognized for her progressive landscape design, advocacy for sustainable and people-friendly public places, and commitment to a climate-appropriate future.



GARDEN PATIO - \$1,000,000

With new pivot doors, this striking urban garden flows from and is adjacent to the Main Dining Room. It is a preferred outdoor dining space for members and has been the site of countless weddings, conferences, receptions, buffets, summer barbecues, and cocktail parties. A complete rejuvenation of the landscape, paving, lighting, trellises, furniture, and sculpture is envisioned.



Building on the original indoor-outdoor aesthetic of the Club, the Garden Patio is envisioned as a highly flexible outdoor room for dining and events, complete with a new landscape, paving, lighting, and building finishes.



CALIFORNIA PATIO - \$750,000

Replacing the existing sliding doors with large pivot doors will enhance the indoor-outdoor connection, making the adjacent outdoor space a lovely and seamless extension of the Morrison Room, with attractive new hardscape, superior lighting, sustainable landscaping, and new service areas. The plantings will accentuate and highlight the beauty of the main room while being appropriate to the climate and environment.

PLAYA CAFÉ - NAMED

The Playa is the preferred campus coffee house. Floor-to-ceiling windows will link to the Garden Patio. Enhancements will include a new serving station, furnishings, flooring, and lighting.

SEQUOIA ROOM - \$500,000

The Sequoia Room is a perfect space for large meetings or smaller, more intimate gatherings and can be partitioned into three rooms, each with its own separate entrance. It features high ceilings, recessed lighting, and natural light from the glass walls on the south wall. The room will seamlessly open out onto the renovated outdoor patio and accentuate the indoor-outdoor, mid-century-modern aesthetic.

HACIENDA ROOM - \$450,000

SIERRA ROOM AND REDWOOD ROOM - \$350,000

These rooms are attractive venues for smaller meetings, including conferences, poster sessions, lunches, smaller celebrations, and receptions. Enhancements include state-of-the-art audio-visual and lighting systems, new carpeting and furniture, and smart tables for conferences.

CORAL GRILL - \$2,500,000

The Coral Grill offers restaurant-style fine dining at the Faculty Club, with wait service and a full range of made-to-order menu items. An outdoor venue, the Coral Grill is often preferred for special business breakfasts and lunches. Donor-funded items will include a new pathway to the Coral Grill, a replacement of the server station, a new canopy, a rebuilt perimeter, and overall beautification of the space.

SUSTAINABILITY - \$2,500,000

The Faculty Club aims to increase its energy savings and achieve LEED Platinum certification by means of several key improvements: replacing all exterior windows and doors with new energy-efficient, high-quality windows and doors; replacing kitchen equipment with energy-efficient systems to achieve Green Kitchen Certification; upgrading electrical infrastructure; and converting all lighting to LED.

CYPRESS BAR & LOUNGE - \$650,000

Historically, the Cypress Bar & Lounge, located on the lower level, has been the center for campus socializing and relaxation at day's end. Relunched in 2019-20, the Cypress Lounge is the only bar on North Campus and features live music and comfortable seating. Modernization efforts include enhancements to lighting, seating, and flooring; rejuvenation of the fireplace; and a redo of the outdoor patio.

FURNITURE AND LIGHTING - \$500,000

New furniture and lighting fixtures will complete the Club's makeover. Stylish furnishings will reinforce the Mid-century-modern aesthetic of the Faculty Club, returning it to its original sleek and optimistic California look.

AUDIO-VISUAL AND TECHNOLOGY UPGRADES - \$400,000

Given the massive adoption of videoconferencing and hybrid meeting formats, planned audio-visual upgrades will provide state-of-the-art communication and presentation technologies.

BILLIARDS ROOM/BOOK EXCHANGE - \$400,000

A long-favored place for quiet contemplation, reading, card playing, solitary work, and, at times, a friendly game of billiards, this room features the Toshi Ashikaga Memorial Book Exchange. A rejuvenation will include new furnishings, carpeting, lighting, and workstations.

SEQUOIA PATIO - \$350,000

The Sequoia Room on the south side of the Club is used constantly for dinners, lunches, and various social and professional gatherings. The adjacent Sequoia Patio is ideal for interpersonal exchanges over coffee or drinks. The patio's new curvaceous design, ringed by fresh plantings and trees, will make it more gracious and popular than ever.

REDWOOD PATIO - \$300,000

The Redwood Room and Cederbaum Family Board Room provide a pleasant view onto this green space, which will be completely transformed through new landscaping that features gentle mounds of purple, yellow, and green sedum to soften the verticality of the patio's four tall redwood trees.

CEDERBAUM FAMILY BOARD ROOM - NAMED


This small private room, appropriate for executive meetings and small lunches, features a smart table and a large flat-screen television.

NORTH HALLWAY - NAMED

The North Hallway, to be named the Victoria Steele Gallery, serves as a gallery space that will focus on mid-century modern architecture and art.

SOUTH ENTRANCE - \$400,000

The renovation of the south entrance provides ADA access to the south side of the building, providing late-night or weekend access to the nearby meeting rooms and Cypress Bar while allowing the remainder of the building to be closed. The southern section of the building is attractive for events of all kinds, being adjacent to the kitchen and having its own restrooms and private patio.



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
